



Important: All documents submitted to UEWM as part of the application becomes the property of the university. This is a common practice among schools in the U.S. Students should always request more than two sets of their transcripts for other future needs.

Admission to the DAOM Program requires a Master's degree or equivalent in Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine from an ACAOM accredited institution, an ACAOM candidate institution, or its equivalent. The applicant must possess a California acupuncture license before entering the doctoral clinical training. All applicants are encouraged to read the School Performance Fact Sheet and catalog prior to signing the enrollment agreement.

****All documents are required to be in English and submitted at the time of admission, with the exception of the Official Transcript, and a State License to Practice Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine****

- Official Transcript(s) (Both in your native language and English) (Foreign transcripts need to be evaluated) *
(No later than the end of the first semester)
- Copy of a Proof of Residency (e.g. Passport, Green Card etc.)
- Two Passport-size Photos
- A Resume (in English)
- Two Letters of Recommendation (in English)
- A statement of purpose explaining your desire to undertake graduate studies at this point in your life. (in English)
- Signed Student Enrollment Agreement
- Official TOEFL score**
- A State License to Practice Acupuncture AND Oriental Medicine in CA or other state/territory (before entering the doctoral clinical training).

*****FEDERAL FINANCIAL AID*****

Students will not be able to request Federal Financial Aid until all required admission documents are submitted.

* Official transcripts must be submitted with the original envelopes in which they were sent. Transcripts from colleges/universities outside of the U.S. must be evaluated for degree, course by course and GPA by an U.S. based official evaluation organization that is NACES Certified. ** For applicants whose education is received not in the English language, a minimum score of 45, a minimum speaking exam score of 18 and a minimum listening exam score of 15 on the TOEFL iBT test is required in order to be admitted to the Chinese-language program ; a minimum TOEFL score of 61, a minimum speaking exam score of 26 and a minimum listening exam score of 22 on the TOEFL iBT test is required in order to be admitted to the English-language program.

** Student is not required to take the TOEFL test if you have earned a minimum of 60 semester units (90 quarter units) from a recognized institution of higher learning where the language of instruction is English.
