UEWM Open Classes program

The Open Classes program at UEWM of MSTCM is open to everyone with two years of baccalaureate-level education, comprising 60 semester units (90 quarter units), at an institution accredited by the U.S. Secretary of Education or at an approved foreign university, or have a bachelor's degree or higher from a recognized institution. A minimum overall grade point average of 2.0 is required.

The Open Classes may help with self enrichment or may prepare you to advance your knowledge for a future health program you may be interested in.

For any applicant whose undergraduate education was not received in the English language, English proficiency will be evaluated by the MSTCM Program's Dean prior to being admitted to the English-language program.

UEWM Open Classes program has the following features:

- Streamlined enrollment
- Same rewarding learning experience as regular students - the Open Classes students have the same rights and responsibilities in classes and will be graded as regular students. Same registration, tuition and other academic policies apply.
- The classes are taught in English. Other language translation and transcription are provided as a supplement as needed.
- Students who receive 3.0 GPA in the Open Classes courses will have priority admission if they decide to apply to UEWM's master program later.
- Students can transfer up to 80 credits of the Open Classes courses to UEWM TCM master program if admitted. If they do transfer more than 60 credits of the courses taught in English, they'll have fulfilled the English proficient requirement.
- The transferability of credits you earn at UEWM is at the complete discretion of an institution to which you may seek to transfer. If the credits that you earn at this institution are not accepted at the institution to which you seek to transfer, you may be required to repeat some or all of your coursework at that institution. For this reason, you should make certain that your attendance at this institution will meet your educational goals. This may include contacting an institution to which you may seek to transfer after attending UEWM to determine if your credits will transfer.

Note: Since UEWM Open Classes program is a non-degree program, I-20, financial aid and graduation ceremony are not provided.

EL102 Curricular Practical Training (1 unit)

Curricular Practical Training (CPT) is an off-campus employment option for F1 students. CPT employment is an alternative work-study internship that is offered by sponsoring employers through cooperative agreements with UEWM. The purpose of CPT is to provide practical training and real world experience in health care as an integral part of the MSTCM degree.

UEWM Catalog Addendum July 31, 2020

Remove the existing English Language Competency paragraph on page 13 and add the updated one as follows:

English Language Competency (updated 28 July,2020)

English language competency is required of all students seeking admission to the master's-level

program. This must be demonstrated by one of the following means:

a) The student must have completed a two-year (60 semester credits or 90 quarter credits) undergraduate-or graduate-level, English-based education in an institution:

(i) accredited by an agency recognized by the U.S. Secretary of Education, or

(ii) in the United Kingdom, Australia, Canada (except Quebec), New Zealand, or Ireland.

In all cases, English must have been both the language of instruction and the language of the curriculum used;

b) Test of English as a Foreign Language Internet
-Based Test (TOEFL® iBT) –

Acceptable scores: TOEFL iBT total score –61 with minimum speaking score – 20 and minimum listening score –17; or

c) International English Language Testing System (IELTS) Academic For mat-

Acceptable scores: IELTS overall band score 6 with minimum speaking score – 6.5 and minimum listening score– 6.
